Context

Regional and local public authorities are responsible for designing, implementing and monitoring Sustainable Energy Action Plans (SEAPs) and they need effective monitoring of local and regional sustainable energy plans requires the availability of data for analysing trends as well as implementing a continuous improvement process of the SEAP actions. The challenge is to initiate a process to regularly exchange data between the different stakeholders involved (utilities, energy data providers, public authorities, etc.).

This process will lead to new requirements and conditions in data exchange such as:

- The access to a wider range of data (energy and non-energy related) for implementation and monitoring of SEAP or similar plans.
- The implementation of more institutionalized monitoring and data exchange processes (Covenant of Mayors, Regional observatories, etc.).
- Potentially new regulatory obligations (for example in the context of the revision of the Energy Efficiency Directive).

Objectives of the Roundtable:

- Exchange visions between energy data providers: What would it take to develop more advanced data collaboration models between municipalities / regions and data providers?
- Demonstrate good examples of structured data exchange and how this data is used for development and monitoring of sustainable energy action plans.
- Formulate possible policy recommendations to the European Commission for a more institutionalized monitoring and data exchange processes.
